(b) It is unlawful for any person not licensed by the Arkansas State Board of Nursing: (1) To practice or offer to practice professional nursing, advanced practice registered nursing, registered practitioner nursing, practical nursing, or psychiatric technician nursing; or

Nurse Practice Act of the State of Arkansas

Arkansas State Board of Nursing Nurse Practice Act. 17-87-312. Criminal Background Checks. (a) Each first-time applicant for a license issued by the Arkansas State Board of Nursing shall apply to the Identification Bureau of the Department of Arkansas State Police for a state and national criminal background check, to be conducted by the Federal Bureau of Investigation.

Arkansas State Board of Nursing Nurse Practice Act 17-87 ...

Arkansas law prevents a nurse practitioner from practicing independently without a written collaborative agreement with a physician. However, some physicians do not accept collaborative relationships. Twenty-two states do not require similar agreements. If NPs were allowed to act independently, more Arkansans would have access to care."

ARKANSAS STATE MEDICAL BOARD

The Arkansas State Board of Nursing (ASBN) may refuse to admit to the examination any candidate and refuse to issue a license, certificate or registration to any applicant if the license, practice privilege, certificate or registration of such person has been revoked or suspended or placed on probation and not reinstated by the jurisdiction which took such action.

ARKANSAS STATE BOARD OF NURSING RULES AND REGULATIONS

Established by the Arkansas Legislature in 1913 to safeguard the life and health of its citizens, the Arkansas State Board of Nursing (ASBN) achieves its mission by developing standards for safe nursing care, approval of nursing schools and regulating licenses to practice nursing. In addition to the Nurse Practice Act and Rules, there are position statements and guidelines for nurses to follow.

The NP may prescribe drugs and devices within the NP's area of practice and may only prescribe controlled substances in Schedules III-V. The Arkansas State Board of Nursing has determined that it is within the scope of practice of a registered nurse (RN) who has demonstrated competency to administer pharmacologic agents under direct supervision of a physician or advanced practice registered nurse (APRN) to produce moderate sedation and to assist in rapid sequence intubation (RSI).
