NINDS Clinical Trials. Definition. Neuroleptic malignant syndrome is a life-threatening, neurological disorder most often caused by an adverse reaction to neuroleptic or antipsychotic drugs. Symptoms include high fever, sweating, unstable blood pressure, stupor, muscular rigidity, and autonomic dysfunction. In most cases, the disorder develops within the first 2 weeks of treatment with the drug; however, the disorder may develop any time during the therapy period.

Key laboratory findings include a greatly elevated creatine phosphokinase (CPK), reflecting muscle breakdown, and an elevated white cell count.
